1. Chomsky's Case against Skinner. The behaviorist psychologist B.F. Skinner was the first theorist to propose a fully fledged theory of language acquisition in his book, *Verbal Behavior* (Skinner 1957). His theory of learning was closely related to his theory of linguistic behavior itself.

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
